

#### 2.0 THE CURRICULUM

## 2.1 Master of Education (M.Ed) in Curriculum Studies

## 2.2 Philosophy of the Programme

To produce transformative and holistic individuals with integrity, relevant competences and skills to serve educational institutions in curriculum design, development, implementation and evaluation.

#### 2.3 Rationale of the Programme

Curriculum study is central to the education process which permeates all other disciplines and all levels of education from preprimary to the university. Most African countries are currently carrying out educational reform. One of the barriers of educational reform is lack of adequately trained curriculum specialists. # 2.7. Academic Regulations of the Programme

# 2.7.1 Admission requirements for the proposed Programme

 a) For admission / eligibility into the above programme, a candidate must satisfy any of the following minimum requirements,

## EITHER;

i) Be a holder of a Bachelor of Education Degree from KeMU or Bachelor of education degree from any other recognized institution with a GPA of 3.00 or its equivalent.

OR

- ii) Be a holder of Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (Bsc) Second class Honors (Upper Division) with a post graduate diploma in education from a recognized institution.
- iii) Be a holder of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed Arts/sciences): or B.A/Bsc.Second Class honors (Lower division) with a post graduate Diploma in Education from a recognized institution and at least two years of relevant work experience.
- b) A relevant course taken in another recognized institution may be considered for credit transfer. Applicants with appropriate prior qualifications may transfer up to 50% of the credit hours. A student may not transfer credits for research and thesis. The minimum transferable grade is B. A fee is charged for each transferred credit.

## 2.7.2 Course Requirements

## a) Student Class Attendance

A candidate will register for the proposed Masters Degree programme through the following:

(i) Coursework, examination and Thesis
