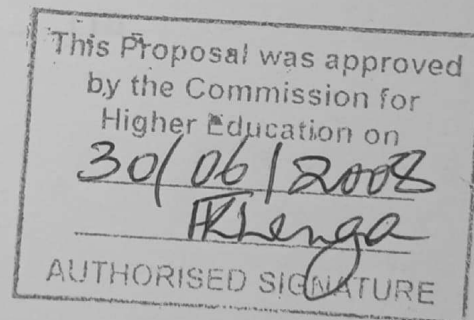

2.0 THE CURRICULUM

2.1 THE RATIONALE

The Bachelor of Laws programme aims at providing students with an opportunity to become fully trained, critical, competent and morally upright lawyers, in order to prepare them for positions in the government, private practice, officers in public and private institutions, inter governmental organizations and non governmental organizations.

There is indeed a need for those with legal training to provide solutions in the national, international and regional arena and this programme aims at producing legal practitioners who would cut a niche in the Eastern African region due to the holistic learning experienced at the University.

2.2 ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR THE PROGRAMME

2.2.1 Admission Requirements

- (a) The common regulations for the Bachelor's degree programme in the university shall apply.
- (b) The Common Regulations for all Bachelor degrees in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences of the University shall apply.

The following shall be eligible for admission into the programme.

The Four Year Degree Programme

- (a) To the Four Year Programme, applicants with a minimum grade of B plain in English at the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education Examination or its equivalent.
- (b) A candidate from a non-English speaking country shall pass a special entrance examination set by CUEA and demonstrate proficiency in written and spoken English or have acquired a TOEFL score of 550 (paper based test) or 213 (computer based test) or a score of at least 7.0 on the International English Language Test System or their equivalent.
